Thriving Communities Grants A Lifeline for Economic Impact and Resilience in Region 8

The Environmental Protection Agency's Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program is one of the most effective tools the federal government has deployed to get environmental and health-related funding directly into the hands of local and underresourced communities that are facing outsized need to address environmental issues.

Designed for efficiency, the program uses qualified regional grantmakers to issue subgrant awards to small community-based organizations that work to address a range of environmental issues in their communities. Each region will distribute nearly \$50 million in subgrants.

Why This Program Matters

Grantmakers like the Mountains and Plains Environmental Grants Hub, collaborate with local partners, providing training and support as they implement projects in their communities in Colorado, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, Wyoming, and 28 Tribal nations. And because these subgrants reach communities that traditionally lack the capacity to access federal funds, demand has been overwhelming.


